Admissions has been busy already this semester. Alora and Rachel have been traveling all over. They visited all of Wyoming, along with several college fairs in Montana, and have a few more fairs in South Dakota and Idaho at the end of October. They have driven over 4,000 miles between the two of them so far and have visited with over 500 students in three weeks. To brag a bit more about CWC, I wanted to point out that we are <u>up 22% in FTE (Full Time Enrollment)</u>. If that isn't something to celebrate, I don't know what is. To be fair, we never got dual/concurrent entered last year (Fall 2024) so the FTE looks lower last fall than normal (making the numbers for this fall look higher), but if you compare this year's numbers to Fall 2023 we are still up 19%, and compared to pre-COVID numbers in Fall 2019 we are still up 20% in FTE.
