R RECREATION

February was an active and community-focused month for R Recreation, with strong participation across youth, adult, and intergenerational programming.

We started our first session of the Wyoming Game & Fish Hunter Safety course in the CWC Health & Science auditorium. This course provided essential outdoor safety education to local youth and community members. We love seeing the parents and their children take this class together.

Jr. Wolverine Basketball League was a new basketball league that we introduced for boys and girls in grades 3rd-6th. In addition to inter-squad scrimmages, the participants had three different opportunities to showcase their development at the halftime of the RHS Wolverine varsity basketball games. This visibility helped celebrate athlete development and strengthened connections between youth programs and school athletics. As we continue to grow this new program, we would like to include the opportunity to play at halftime of CWC Rustler Basketball games.

We provided accessible, family-friendly recreation space for the community with our Family Open Gym at Riverton Middle School. This was held three consecutive weeks in the evenings, and we saw roughly 100 participants of all ages.

We continued to celebrate National Girls & Women in Sports Day with our massive event on February 14 at the Riverton Middle School. This is our 17th year as the only community in Wyoming to host an event celebrating Title IX and promoting girls to be active in sports. CWC's women's soccer, basketball, and volleyball teams all took part in this opportunity to empower the young ladies in our community. Rustler energy and pride was showcased throughout the event. In the category of Adult and Lifelong Learning programs, morning and evening Adult Fitness Classes began at CWC Fitness Center, expanding adult wellness opportunities. CWC's very own Kenna Sweglar is the instructor, and she has developed a very loyal base who greatly appreciate her motivation, commitment, and leadership.

The Spring Baking Series began even though February technically isn't spring yet. The students prepared delicacies like eggs benedict from scratch, baked Alaska ice cream desert and angel food cake from scratch. This series of classes was held at Riverton High School's Home Economics room. Our Baking Series' classes continue to demonstrate strong interest in skill-based enrichment programming.

We hosted our monthly Bingo in Rusty's Corner in the Student Center. The theme this month was Flannel February, and we had a fabulous flannel turnout! This continues to serve as consistent community engagement, and we enjoy connecting the community to the campus.

For community board engagement, Mary had the honor of hosting the first-ever Boys & Girls Club of Central Wyoming board meeting in the Riverton community. We have a local advisory council that meets quarterly, but this was the BGCCW monthly board meeting and included board members from across the state. It was another opportunity to further strengthen our partnerships and identify additional opportunities to serve the youth in our community.

For some professional development, Mary and Ady attended a statewide community education meeting alongside directors and coordinators from Casper College, Eastern Wyoming College, Gillette College, Western Wyoming, CWC-Lander, and CWC-Jackson. The meeting provided valuable opportunities for collaboration, discussions of challenges, and an exchange of innovative programming ideas.

As we look into March, we are excited to introduce a new Viking Weave class, a Softball Skills Clinic, and the first class of our 'My Family and Me' series, Grandparents & Me. Additionally, we are excited to share a personal milestone within our team as we are eagerly anticipating the arrival of Ady Thomas's first baby boy, due mid-March. We look forward to celebrating this special moment with her and her husband.
