Cindy Hayford and Jerri Prejean met with Food Sovereignty and toured the farm out here at Fort Washakie. We also did a tour of Eastern Shoshone's new Tribal Health facility and they scheduled 15-20 employees to take the Customer Service and Workplace Readiness Workshop on March 15th.

Jerri Prejean and Erika Yarber of the Wind River Development Fund met with Wind River Cares about the Recompete Program, and they will schedule Customer Service Training for all 400+ employers over the course of the summer.

Trail Building will be working on a bike trail connecting the Fort Washakie High School to the middle school this Spring. They will also be working with Game and Fish to clear trails and upgrade camping/day-use spots at various lakes out at Fort Washakie.

CNA has continued to fill each session (2 per semester) with 12 students. There is also a CNA course that will be offered during the summer, and Judy McGilvray will be leading it, but Recompete students will also be able to attend.

Culinary will also be ongoing, and Jenny Joyes is starting to fill classes now. She taught the above classes out here at Fort Washakie, and 8 completed and received a Manager's Certification in ServSafe.

EMT Instructor Kyle Schultz is creating content and curriculum, and his classes will start this fall. But during the summer months, he will be offering workshops (CPR, etc.) More to come.

Workforce Training will continue throughout the summer months. Jerri Prejean will be offering Customer Service and Workplace Readiness Workshops to the above mentioned as well as to the public. These workshops will be facilitated in various locations, based on demand.

HiSET instructor Andrew Parra was hired, and he is stationed out here at Fort Washakie along with Cindy Hayford and Jerri Prejean. He currently has 2 students enrolled, and I will be giving a presentation to HiSet students on May 9th about the programs Recompete offers.
